

Our First Responder™ alcohol-hand sanitizer is made per FDA's guidelines. FDA has only approved this liquid version and has specifically stated that no modifications can be made to the formulation. *Watery is good to cover all surfaces of the hand and quickly evaporates.*

No, At Hydromer® we use only the FDA approved formulation for our First Responder™ brand, which has only alcohol, glycerin, hydrogen peroxide and purified water.

FDA considers hand sanitizer to be an OTC drug. *Hydromer®* is listed on the National Drug Code (NDC) Directory and has registration numbers to sell the FDA-mandated hand rub sanitation formulation. under our First Responder™ brand.
